

**Kyle Spragens** is the Statewide Waterfowl Coordinator for the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, based in Olympia, and serves as liaison to the Pacific flyway council. He is originally from the Northern San Francisco Bay Area and is a graduate of Humboldt State University (BSc & MSc) with an emphasis in Natural Resources and Wildlife Management. His previous waterfowl ecology adventures have spanned from the Canadian Arctic tundra to lagoons along the Black Sea in Turkey to fishponds in Hong Kong's Pearl River Delta; including six years as a Wildlife Biologist for the USGS-San Francisco Bay Estuary Field Station and three years as Senior Waterfowl Biologist for the USFWS-Yukon Delta NWR in Bethel, Alaska. His background has focused on cooperation with partners across the Pacific and East Asian-Australasian Flyways conducting monitoring and research projects related to nesting waterfowl, migration chronology, sea-level rise impacts to migratory bird habitats, and spatio-temporal dynamics in habitat use.
